RE: S2105

Portsmouth Water and Fire District is writing in support of Senate Bill 2105, introduced by Senator Linda L. Ujifusa.


Under current law (R.I. Gen. Laws § 24-8.1-2), the relocation of utilities places a significant and often unpredictable burden on municipal and quasi-municipal public water suppliers. These requirements are imposed without adequate consideration of several critical factors, including: (1) the availability of funding; (2) existing capital plans and construction already underway; (3) potential conflicts with short-, medium-, and long-term system planning; and (4) the necessary permitting and regulatory approval processes required by the Rhode Island Water Resources Board, the Rhode Island Department of Health, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

In many cases, the roadway projects subject to § 24-8.1-2 are supported by federal funding. Requiring local utilities to contribute financially to projects that are already fully funded creates unnecessary complications. Such requirements may jeopardize compliance with federal funding conditions and impose additional, unwarranted costs on water suppliers and their ratepayers. Moreover, it compels utilities to subsidize projects for which the Rhode Island Department of Transportation already has sufficient funding.

Senate Bill S2105 would provide a more equitable and practical framework for utility relocations by better aligning financial responsibility with project funding sources and reducing undue burdens on public water suppliers.

For these reasons, we respectfully urge the committee to support passage of Senate Bill 2105 . Thank you for your time and consideration.
