Dear Chair DiPalma, First Vice Chair Ciccone, Second Vice Chair Felag, Secretary Acosta, and Members of the Senate Finance Committee,

My name is David Brunetti, I am from Burrillville, RI, and I oppose Senate Bill 2546 for “State Forests and Forestry Projects”.

While I, and many others, have held the position for many years that the Department of Environmental Management is woefully understaffed and underfunded, I can think of many other areas in this Department for which additional staffing could be used to address pressing issues, including for an invasive plant species removal program to address the ongoing insect apocalypse and the massive decline of birds, funding for Species of Greatest Conservation Need as part of the RI State Wildlife Action Plan, as well as funding for re-establishment of the Rhode Island Natural Heritage Program to identify, monitor, and protect biodiversity for the state would be more appropriate.

To add to this is the issue that this legislation is woefully non-specific; severely lacking in detail for description of what these employees would be doing in such a program, as well as what extent of line-item funding would be needed for personnel and for what types of equipment and supplies.

External to the needs of the Department for increased personnel and funding is the need of funding for many programs to address the programs related to climate change mandates, housing for the homeless, etc.

Therefore, I urge you to oppose S 2546.
