Dear Chair DiPalma and Committee members,

My name is Scott Callas. I live in Providence, and I am writing in support of Bill S3013.

It has been over 10 years since regular gas-powered car inspection fees were increased in Rhode Island, while we have added much higher taxes and fees to electric vehicles. We need to ensure we are not disproportionately allowing increases on some and not equitably across the board. We see our state struggling to provide an accessible public transit system and also our small businesses struggling financially, which both are great contributors to Rhode Island's economic successes. This bill will ensure both have more funding to ensure a better pathway to a more prosperous future.

As a transit rider and supporter, I am relying on you to support this simple solution for increasing revenue and ridership for RIPTA. Securing new and diverse funding streams that do not rely on the federal government or declining gas tax revenue will not only achieve financial stability, but allow for the expansion of service to meet the needs of a growing population that requires access to the affordable and sustainable travel option that public transit provides.

Let me be direct. This fee increase would affect me, as I own a car that has to be inspected. I am happy to bear this minor cost to more securely fund our critical public transportation system. I am sure you will hear testimony from other car owners opposed to any increase, as owning a car is already expensive enough. And that is the point. Our underfunded public transit system mandates reliance on an expensive, depreciating asset. This fee increase is a drop in the bucket compared to the overall cost, and it could help eliminate the requirement entirely for many Rhode Islanders to own a car. Who wouldn't pay an extra \$20 now to avoid paying thousands yearly in the future?

I urge you to support Senator Vargas' S3013, to increase revenue for RIPTA, while also helping the businesses receive an increase so that they can afford to perform inspections. This gives Rhode Island residents access to affordable transportation and provides sustainable funding for public transit to thrive.
