



Testimony of Matthew Netto, AARP Rhode Island

In support of Senate Bill 3086

Senate Finance Committee

May 26, 2026

Dear Chairman DiPalma and members of the Senate Finance Committee:

On behalf of AARP- RI and our over 125,000+ members in Rhode Island we are in strong support of Senate Bill 3086, the Rhode Island Secure Choice Retirement Savings Program. AARP is a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization dedicated to helping people ages 50 and older to improve their quality of life as they age. In doing so, we focus not only on those nearing and currently in retirement, but those who are at all stages of their careers and will retire in the future.

This state, like many others, is facing a retirement crisis. The average Social Security benefit in Rhode Island is about \$24,500 a year, while on average older families in Rhode Island spend \$30,000 a year on food, utilities, and health care alone¹. Social Security was never intended to be a person's sole source of income in retirement. At this rate, one out of every two middle-class retirees will be unable to afford their basic needs in retirement- things like medicine, utilities, and rent. This will cost taxpayers down the line in social services

Nearly half (40% or 172,000) of Rhode Island private sector employees did not have access to a retirement savings plan through their employer prior to the RISavers program. The RISavers program launched on October 15, 2025. The state of Rhode Island entered an interstate partnership with the state of Connecticut to ensure that fees and costs associated with the program were as low as possible. Just a few months after the launch of RISavers over 556 businesses have enrolled and over 3,627 Rhode Islanders can now saving for retirement through their paycheck. In total, they have saved \$870,000 so far.

Twenty states have enacted new programs to help private sector workers save their own money for retirement. Seventeen of these programs are up and running (including Rhode Island) with more than \$2.75 billion in assets under management, it is clear these programs are successful in helping close the retirement savings gap.

RISavers will have a tremendous impact on the state of Rhode Island, its businesses and its taxpayers. AARP Rhode Island thanks you for supporting the creation of the RISavers program over the past several years and asks you to pass Senate Bill 3086 so that the General Treasurer's office can continue to make this program effective and efficient for all Rhode Island workers.
