Subject: Testimony in SUPPORT for S2033

I am testifying in strong support of Senate Bill 2033. This bill will improve safety and security for prescribers of essential medications for managing medication abortions, early pregnancy loss, and retained pregnancy tissue after delivery without endangering patients.

The ability to prescribe mifepristone and misoprostol to brick-and-mortar pharmacies, rather than requiring dispensation in the office, drastically increases access for patients who need these medications for terminations or management of miscarriage. However, as someone who prescribes these medications, I have personally been approached or reached out to by community members who have seen my name associated with reproductive health medication prescription and have asked personal questions that made me question my safety- even while prescribing legal, safe medications that are within my scope of practice. I should be able to practice to within the full limits of my license without intimidation.

I support S2033 because access to essential medications for reproductive care shouldn't depend on a provider wondering if they will be personally targeted for helping their patients using safe and efficacious treatments. With the current hostile political landscape for reproductive health, our state must do everything we can to stand for the fundamental right for people to be able to decide whether, when, and how to have children, and to allow providers to help their patients safely manage pregnancies and their potential complications. I urge the committee and legislature to vote favorably for S2033 to provide practice name, rather than personal name, of prescribers for medication abortion medications.
