I'm deeply connected to the type one diabetes community in Rhode Island and proudly serve on the Board of Directors for Camp Surefire, which is a leading resource in Rhode Island for children who live with type one diabetes and their families. Simply put, I consider myself fortunate to know many of the courageous Rhode Islanders who live with type one diabetes.

I'm writing to ask that you support House Bill No. 7075, The Matthew Federico Diabetic Safety Act. Managing type one diabetes is a constant battle that consumes you every single day and night. Proper management can include eating at all times of day and night, administering insulin at any time of day or night, and tracking glucose readings and trends just to keep your glucose within a healthy range. It's exhausting, and it always carries the risk of life threatening levels of low glucose, called hypoglycemia, even when managed well. This bill would require health plans with prescription drug coverage to provide glucagon, or other related medications, free of any copays or deductibles. Rhode Islanders' access to these life saving medications should not depend upon whether they can afford them. Furthermore, providing these medications to those who need them allows those living with type diabetes to avoid expensive emergency visits to the hospital.

I'm writing to ask that you support House Bill No. 7188. This bill would create a \$25 cap for a thirty day supply of equipment required to properly manage type one diabetes. These supplies include insulin delivery or insulin pump supplies and glucose monitoring supplies. Without such a cap these supplies can cost several hundred dollars per month even with insurance, making them inaccessible to children and adults who need them. Additionally, supporting this bill would allow more Rhode Islanders to properly manage their diabetes, which would help avoid serious health complications later and keep healthcare costs down for patients and insurance companies.
