Dear Chairwoman Murray members of the Committee,

CNE wants to thank Sen. Appollonio and the cosponsors of this bill because adopting and fully implementing the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (IMLC) would strengthen Rhode Island's health care workforce by making it easier for qualified physicians to obtain licensure and practice across state lines. This is particularly important at a time where access to specialty care and timely appointments often depends on regional collaboration and telehealth.

The IMLC preserves the state's authority to regulate physicians while reducing unnecessary administrative barriers that delay recruitment and patient access. With the legislation already enacted, timely rulemaking by the Department of Health and the Office of the Health Insurance Commissioner is the necessary final step to realize the workforce, access, and patient care benefits the General Assembly intended.
