Re: Support for Senate Bill 2562 - MomsPRN and PediPRN

Dear Chairwoman Murray and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to express the Mental Health Association's support for Senate Bill 2562, which would provide sustainable funding for two psychiatric phone consultation services benefiting children and pregnant and postpartum mothers.

Parents and families are consistently referred to their primary care physician for help when they suspect a behavioral health concern in themselves or their child. Physicians are relied on as trusted sources of information concerning behavioral health, and they provide important interventions such as education, screening, referral, and sometimes treatment. They cannot face Rhode Island's growing behavioral health needs alone, however. They require continuing education and timely consultation in order to remain effective practitioners. The MomsPRN and PediPRN phone lines are crucial investments into our healthcare system, and allow for medical professionals and other frontline workers to practice safe and informed services.

Behavioral health concerns affect people of all ages; about 50% of lifetime mental illness begins by age 14.<sup>1</sup> Research shows, however, that the average age of treatment is about 11 years after the onset of symptoms.<sup>2</sup> We can close that gap by increasing screenings, lowering wait times, and improving access to treatment for young people through teleconsultation for care providers. In addition, 19% of mothers experience postpartum depression.<sup>3</sup> These parents often turn to their healthcare team for guidance, and that team will be better able to offer support with access to consultation and training.
