We are writing in support of this bill, which would establish a position for a state employee at the Rhode Island Department of Health to coordinate research, training, outreach, and education regarding Alzheimer's disease and other dementia-related disorders.

Alzheimer's disease and other dementia-related disorders have been and will continue to be a concern for our state.

The Department of Health has created a plan to help address dementia, but at this time we do not have a role to implement it. The plan includes strategies for prevention as well as how to ensure the best possible care for people with dementia and support for their caregivers. We believe this plan will be highly beneficial to the state, but only if it is implemented. This bill would provide the staff person needed to oversee the plan's administration.

We hope you will pass this bill, and we at the Commission look forward to working with the future dementia services coordinator.
