I also serve as one, if not the only, voice of the men and women who are not yet fortunate enough to be represented by an electrical labor union in the state of Rhode Island.

The debate over renewable energy for some reason never seems to end. In my years of testifying and advocating for renewables I would say there is rarely any legitimate opposition to the subject matter. However, one thought that has some merit is solar energy in particular could benefit from energy storage. That stored energy could be used to supply electricity in the hours when the modules do not produce. It is not a necessity to have energy storage to make solar and other renewables a wise choice, but it certainly can make a great energy source even better.

As most are aware, I have worked with the labor, environmental and development community to make wise choices with renewable installations. We worked for several years to pass, in consensus, solar siting legislation to protect our forests and drive development to more acceptable locations such as brown fields and properties such as those detailed in this bill. These locations that are undesirable for most anything else and lay useless for the most part. Allowing energy storage systems by right on abandoned property just makes good sense and helps us get one step closer to our shared goals of a cleaner world for those who follow us.
