In particular, I ask that you carefully review the negative impacts on the safety of Rhode Islanders of the following bills:

* S.2162 – Sentencing based on parental status Case number 2024-62. State of Rhode Island vs. Melissa Federico. There were 40 charges, 30 which were felonies dismissed by Peter Neronha's office. The attorney general waited 6 months to do so taking advantage of a loophole. This case should be re opened. Melissa Federico is not fit to help raise two beautiful kids ages 4 and 6.
