**RE: Senate Bill 2390: Gift Card Fraud**

Dear Chair LaMountain:

My name is Scott Bromberg and I am the President & CEO of the Rhode Island Food Dealers Association, a trade association established in 1909 to serve the needs of the food industry in the State of Rhode Island. Our membership includes chain and independent grocery retailers, wholesalers, suppliers, distributors, food manufacturers, brokers, and other organizations affiliated with the food industry in our state. As an industry, we are among the state's largest employers and revenue generators.

Gift card fraud is an increasingly sophisticated threat to unsuspecting Rhode Island retailers and consumers, both young and old. Currently, people who tamper with or deactivate gift cards or steal redemption information often face minimal consequences because the cards technically have no "value" until purchased. Increasing the penalty of gift card fraud will bring Rhode Island in line with the digital reality of modern retail crime. By subjecting these offenses to harsher penalties, Senate Bill 2390 provides Rhode Island law enforcement and prosecutors with the necessary tools to hold violators accountable. This will ensure that when a Rhode Islander buys a gift card, the value they paid for is legally protected.

In summary, Rhode Island's food industry is one of the largest – and steadiest – employers and revenue generators in the state. Senate Bill 2390 would have a positive impact on our member stores, both large and small, and would make Rhode Island one of the leaders in this area. We ask you to recognize their position when considering Senate Bill 2390.
