I am writing as a Rhode Island resident to share my concerns regarding several criminal justice proposals currently scheduled for hearings before the committee.

In particular, I ask that you carefully review the negative impacts on the safety of Rhode Islanders of the following bills:

- * S.2162 – Sentencing based on parental status
- * S.2290 – Cashless Bail
- * S.2731 – Sentencing reconsideration after 10 years of imprisonment

While rehabilitation and second chances are important, Rhode Island must also maintain strong standards of accountability and ensure that policies do not undermine public safety.

Historically when you review other states (New York, California, Washington, Oregon) that have invoked similar criminal justice reforms, they have had a severe impact public safety and major increase in crime.
