**RE: Senate Bill #2953: An Act Relating to Courts and Civil Procedure – Procedure Generally – Causes of Action**

Dear Chairman LaMountain:

I write on behalf of the Rhode Island Judiciary to express our support for Senate Bill #2953, scheduled to be heard this evening before the Senate Committee on Judiciary. If enacted, this bill would provide mediators and other staff within the Family Court's mediation program with immunity from financial liability for any claim, demand, or suit resulting from acts or omissions performed within the scope of their employment.

The Rhode Island Family Court mediation program is a service the court provides parties to assist in resolving cases involving divorce, child custody, child placement, parenting time, and other related matters pending before the court. This legislation, if passed, would extend immunity to the mediators and other staff in the Family Court's mediation program for acts or omissions occurring in the course of their duties and within the scope of their employment. The immunity would apply only to acts or omissions which may be negligence, but are not wanton, malicious or grossly negligent. The immunity mirrors that which is afforded to certain employees and volunteers of the Family Court's Court Appointed Special Advocate program, as set forth in R.I. Gen Laws § 9-1-27.2.
