## **GKC Suggested Amendments**

- On Page 3. Section 21-28.12-3 (3), lines 15-16
  - (3) A kratom product that contains a substance other than a non-psychoactive substance necessary for the preparation, processing, or manufacturing of said product.
    - Strike this language. Subpoint (2) under 21-28.12-3 already protects against substances that are injurious to consumers. Prohibiting psychoactive substances is far too broad as innocuous psychoactive substances, like sugar or caffeine, cacao powder and many other widely used substances that are often found in dietary supplements.



- On Page 4. Section 21-28.12-3 (12), (v) lines 15-17
  - (v) The following statement: "These statements have not been evaluated by the United States Food and Drug Administration. This product is not intended to diagnose, treat, cure, or prevent any disease."
    - Strike the works "united states"
      - The actual federal labeling standard doesn't include the word "united states"
